Joel Burns—Head of the FBI in Bakersfield

Joel has a double bachelor in Political Science and Sociology and a masters in Homeland Security. He served in the US Army for 8 years, first in Military Intelligence then moved over to Army CID at Fort Hood, TX. Deployed to Iraq in 2004. Joined the FBI in early 2010 and was first stationed in New Jersey working international terrorism. He moved to Bakersfield in 2014 and currently he is the Joint Terrorism Task Force Coordinator for the Bakersfield FBI office

Joel had a video presentation about and explaining the terrorist history or evolution that's led to ISIS or ISIL he used the term interchangeably. He took many questions from the audience, but a few he didn't have clearance to speak about. The bottom line is that we all need to be vigilant to be the eyes and ears around us as their limited number of agents can't be everywhere. The laws on privacy – First Amendment Rights make it difficult to act on some situations. There must be a verbalization of an action that is being planned by an individual. They can say they are all for being a terrorist, it's only saying that they are going to go to do the thing that is a crime.
