Rotarians Step In To Help With New Children's Museum in Ventura County

magine a place right here in Ventura County where kids can learn, explore and discover. Imagine no more. A children's museum is coming to Ventura County. kidSTREAM, already providing science, technology, reading, engineering, arts and math (STREAM) programs to youth, will be opening a permanent children's museum in Camarillo.

kidSTREAM will encompass 16,500 square feet of indoor space and another 19,000 square feet of outdoor space on 2 1/2 acres at the site of the former Camarillo Library. The museum is projected to open its outdoor space in 2022.

Rotarians Are Early Supporters.

"Our local Rotarians have been early champions of kid-STREAM. They've helped us spread the word about the museum throughout the county," says Michael Shanklin, who was hired as kidSTREAM's executive director one month before last year's shutdown and is a member of the Camarillo Sunrise Rotary. His Rotary Club recently held the kidSTREAM 1st Annual Charity Golf Tournament with all proceeds going to museum. "We are so grateful for Rotarian support. They truly have passion for our mission and seeing that our efforts succeed."

kidSTREAM was the brainchild of president and founder Kristie Akl. She was inspired to pursue a dream of a local museum while driving home in bumper-to-bumper traffic with her three daughters from a children's museum in Pasadena. That was five years ago. Since then, kidSTREAM programs have reached about 30,000 kids at community events throughout the county.

"kidSTREAM's mission is to create a wonderful environment for children that encourages critical thinking, innovation and lifelong learning all within the elements of STREAM," says Akl.

Filling A Need.

One of kidSTREAM's biggest challenges is to change public perception of a children's museum from something that is "nice to have," to something that is critically needed. The pandemic brought its importance to light.

"As the pandemic and subsequent school lockdowns continued, it became more and more evident to us that there was an everwidening educational gap, and kidSTREAM could be a much needed bridge to increase access to hands-on educational learning, especially for children who otherwise wouldn't have access," says Akl.



As part of its outreach, kidSTREAM recently delivered 200 summer learning kits in Spanish to farmworkers to give to their children. The organization created "STREAMing at Home" videos that share hands-on experiments kids could do with household items. The free videos are available on the kid-STREAM website and on YouTube.

"Since public events were canceled, we've used much of the downtime to plan and design the museum and develop fundraising campaigns," says Shanklin. "Not only will the museum be a focal point for STREAM learning, it will become an economic driver for the area. Businesses that are considering relocating or expanding in Ventura County take into account the county's quality of life and its cultural aspects. The museum fills that niche. It will also be a destination point that will draw people from around the region, helping the local hospitality sector. We'll be a significant job creator too. We'll need to fill numerous STREAM instructor openings and offer internships to teens thinking of careers in STREAM."

A Key Donation.

In March, the City Council of Camarillo unanimously approved donating the city's former library site to kidSTREAM, in part, to help fulfill the council's community enrichment objectives. The estimated value of the building and property is about \$900,000. "The City of Camarillo has been extremely generous in its donation," says Shanklin. "It enables us to focus on raising capital for the facility. We estimate the total cost of the project to be \$2.4 million."

Once kidSTREAM opens its doors, it hopes to reach an estimated 150,000 children annually onsite and online, by presenting at schools and participating in community events.

"It is because of the Rotary's underlying motto of 'Service Above Self' that Rotarians have wholeheartedly leaned into this project to help kidSTREAM grow" says Akl. "Thank you, Rotary, for making the dream of kidSTREAM a reality."

RYLA Program "Life-Changing" for High School Students

y Rotary moment happened at RYLA in the early 2000's. I was invited by a fellow Rotarian to become a RYLA counselor. I didn't know anything about RYLA, but I decided I would give it a try. RYLA stands for Rotary Youth Leadership Awards. It is a worldwide Rotary program that was started in Queensland, Australia in 1959. RYLA is a perfect example of Rotary's passion in developing future leaders.

Our District 5240 has its RYLA Program for four days in a beautiful setting in Ojai called Camp Ramah. We invite about 200 top notch high school sophomores and juniors to step away from their day-to-day responsibilities and learn such things as ethics, leadership, teambuilding, public speaking, and more. The keynote speakers are some of the best I've ever heard.

I was particularly moved by the Diversity Class, where I was one of the counselors. I really didn't know what to expect when I walked into the room about ten minutes after the start of class. The gravity and the tension within the room was palpable. There were about 20 students in the room; ten boys, ten girls, and four RYLA Counselors (including myself). I can say that the students learn a lot about themselves during the class. In my view, the instructors could charge \$800-\$1000 an hour for the work they do here. They learn that there are usually many other students just like them that are also going through similar hardships in their life. Tears start to flow. Kleenex boxes are passed around the room. Then, you witness students begin to console one another.

After a student attends Diversity Class, you notice the students have a greater empathy toward one another, and a greater understanding about their fellow students. In my view, this class is the cornerstone of what makes RYLA District 5240 so special. The keynote speakers are phenomenal. The talent show is amazing. But it's the Diversity Class that pulls everything together for that four-day experience.

Each year, thousands of young people take part in the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) program worldwide. Young people are chosen for their leadership potential to attend an allexpenses-paid camp to discuss leadership skills and to learn those skills through practice. Rotary clubs and districts select participants and facilitate the event's curriculum.

A Big Believer In Giving Back

r. Thomas Jovicich wears two hats—he's an endodontist in Encino with a practice dating back to 1988 and he's the owner of UNITS® Ventura County, a portable storage unit company serving communities throughout the county. Jovicich actually wears a third hat. The long-time Ventura County resident is a volunteer who is always looking for ways to give back to the community.

Jovicich currently owns a traditional storage business outside the Phoenix area. When the UNITS franchise became available in Ventura County, he jumped at the chance to own a business close to home.

Jovicich opened UNITS Ventura County in January 2021 in the middle of the pandemic when many stores and offices were shut down. Even so, he has been busy. Storage containers are dropped off at business and residential locations when customers have short and long-term storage needs, usually as the result of construction or repair work or when needed to move locally or long distances.

Since UNITS Ventura County has opened, Jovicich has used the time to tell people about his locally owned and operated stor-

age service. He also offers nonprofits the opportunity to use the containers at no cost. "If a charity has a need for a temporary storage unit, it just needs to contact us and we'll arrange a drop off," says Jovicich.

Committed to Charity Work. Jovicich's family belongs to Calvary Community Church in Westlake Village. Prior to the pandemic, the family would prepare food and feed the homeless every Tuesday night at the church. "It's important to pay it forward," says Jovicich. "I made it a point to pass along this giving attitude to my kids." Jovicich expects the Tuesday night food preparation and distribution will resume this summer.

"What I like about Rotarians is they are like-minded people who understand the importance of helping others," says Jovicich. "I hope I can bring my skills as a people person and problem solver to Rotary when club events and other activities ramp up. It always makes me much happier to give than to receive."

tiple shirts that could match.... socks, sweaters, leggings. \$125 goes a long way with Target's sales, but we were going to go over budget, so I was happy to cover the difference because she was so excited.

As we were about to check out she turned to me and said, "Thank you. All of my clothes are hand-me-downs and I've never picked something out in a store for myself." It took everything I had to smile and tell her it was my pleasure - I just wanted to cry and take her back to buy everything in the department! The impression and feeling we leave these kids with is lasting and I look forward to it every year!

I am proud of several projects our club has done recently.

Breakfast with a Rotarian - We invited high school students that wanted to learn about certain careers to join our meeting. We paired each with someone in that field. Students could ask the Rotarian anything about the business.

Lunch with Rotarians - We went to the high school with pizza in hand and we sat at the library tables and spoke to students about the working world. We had 25 Rotarians with 2-3 students at each table.

We have 30 to 50 teams in total in the age classification groups. We work with the City of Oxnard Recreation Department. These are the oldest middle school basketball tourneys in the United States.

The second project is the celebration of National Arbor Day where the club has lunch with elementary school students. We sit with the students and teacher during lunch and then the students put on a program related to trees and their value. Some read poems, sing,



act or share what they have done concerning trees. After lunch we complete the planting of trees with Rotarians assisting the students on how it should be done. A proclamation is read and presented to the school and a little history about National Arbor Day is given. This has been done for 20 years at the club with adjustments made during covid-19.

The club project I am most proud of is the scholarships that our club awards to Ventura students. This year Ventura East awarded over \$125,000.00 so far and will be presenting 5 more to local nursing students. My personal Rotary Moment was actually a year in the making. I was District Polio Chair for district 5300. Over the year I learned so much not only about the fight to end Polio, but the obstacles involved with inoculations. I couldn't be prouder of being a Rotarian.

Rotary's Group Study Exchange was a life changing event for me. The opportunity to travel abroad representing our District to another District in another country, and to meet so many Rotarians from another country who have experienced such a different life experience and serve Rotary in such a different way was such an eye opener!

Diane Galvin Rotary Club of Moorpark n 2005, about 12 years after I joined Rotary, I came across a newspaper article on the front page of the LA Times which reported the extreme poverty, hunger and lack of water in the country of Niger, West Africa. In the article, a woman from Ojai by the name of Leslie Clark had been working on raising money to help several groups of nomads in that country and was facing a daunting task of helping all the people affected by a recent drought. I decided to reach out to Leslie and explore possibilities of Rotary assistance.

Within the next few months, I decided to learn as much as I could about writing Rotary grants for international projects. I was amazed to find that many Rotarians in other clubs were so willing to help in this learning process – people like Ron Block (Newbury Park club), Diego Velazquez (Conejo Valley club) and Kay Bliss (Ojai Rotary). With their help in the grant process and in raising money, we were able to write a grant for over \$65,000! The grant provided for the digging of 15 new fresh-water wells, herd replacements for food and milk, school supplies, and a 4-wheel drive vehicle.

Since 2006, we have continued to bring Rotary together in providing much needed services to the Nomads in Niger. We have written 20 grants in collaboration with 50 Rotary clubs, raising over \$600,000! These grants have brought more food and water, while building schools, providing school supplies,



and adding a medical clinic and eventually created a midwife training program. Our efforts have saved thousands of lives!

This shows the power of Rotary as so many clubs and Rotarians worked together to make a difference!
