Speaker – Barbara Robertson & scholarship recipients – Scholarship Foundation of Santa Barbara

- Barbara is president and CEO of the Scholarship Foundation (started in February of 2020)
- Len Smallberg is recognized for his amazing work with the foundation
- From Barbara's presentation
 - Mission: inspire, encourage, and support students to and through college
 - o In 59 years: \$137 million has gone to 55,000 students
 - o In 2021: \$8 million has gone to 2,247 students
 - What do they do? Scholarships, completing aid applications (FAFSA & CADAA), financial aid and college access presentations, financial aid workshops, summers programming, drop-ins at local high schools, & more
 - Want to make sure students are aware of every dollar they're eligible for
 - Why? Rising college costs, high student debt, support post-secondary completion rates, access to financial resources, impact life trajectory (both personal and professional), community impact
 - Primary criteria used to select students: depends on what scholarships are being given (grantee defines the path in which students get selected), as long as you graduate from a local high school then you are eligible
 - How do they do it? Donor support, dedicated community volunteers, board of directors, highly invested staff team
 - o College graduates: earn more, have higher employment rates, & more
 - Recipient information:
 - Students are attending 308 different colleges
 - All qualified students were funded
 - Students have a 3.9 average high school GPA & 3.5 in college
 - 50% are first-generation
 - Showed table of the institution type that students are attending
 - Peri Wilby shared her experience with the Scholarship Foundation, she will be attending UC Berkeley in the fall. She hopes to be an attorney in the future.
 - Christian Hodishi shared his experience with the Scholarship Foundation, he attends Cal Poly SLO. He is now an employee on campus and involved with many activities.
