CRAFT TALK: Stan Darrow

Stan gave a wonderful craft talk about his life and some of his hobbies.

Our guest speaker tonight was Kielle Hurton from Junior League. She presented a project Junior League is working on to help and inform the community about human sex trafficking.

Santa Barbara is a hub for human trafficking. We have what many would call a perfect storm for this type of activity in our area, many hotels, affluent community, college town, lack of housing. Those at risk for being taken into this community are at risk youth. Most are under the age of 24 the average age is from 9 to 14 years. Foster youth, runaways, homeless teens, etc. These individuals are picked up within 48hours. Sex trafficking has grown tremendously in our country

over the last several years. The number of slaves in the world is the highest in history an estimated 4.5 million women and girls trapped in forced exploitation.

Junior League has found that there is not enough rehabilitated shelter for these victims and many rescued individuals have ran back to their captives and continue the cycle again. Junior League is fundraising for a new shelter here in Santa Barbara for these victims.
