

### To the rescue

From the right, Santa Maria Fire Chief Frank Ortiz, Dale Johnson, president of the Santa Maria Breakfast Rotary Club, and other members of the Rotary Club stend with a fire truck the club purchased to help out a Mexican fire department decimated by a fireworks addition. Rotary Club members chipped in \$7,000 to purchase a 1975 fire truck formerly used by the Santa Maria Fire Department but which the city recently declared surplus. Santa Maria's loss is the gain of the Mexican city of Celays near Mexica City, which lost many of their fireflighters and fireflighting equipment in a large blaze that leveled 10 city blocks and killed 50 people. Ortiz and others will soon take the fire truck on a long road trip toward Mexico. Rotarians are expected to dive about helf way to Celeya, where they'll turn over the truck to Mexican officials headed to the U.S.




