THE EYES HAVE IT!



The Good Doctor... aka the Emperor kicked off the year with tips for losing those extra holiday pounds one tip was eating less ... well he made sure there would be less eating at last week's meeting by sharing lots of

"gory" photos of cornea abrasions, subconjunctival hemorrhage and chemical conjunctivitis (way to go Doc). The *Health for Self* tip was about common eye problems. There's the corneal abrasion—which can be caused by trauma from the fingernail, paper and makeup or flying leaves, glass or wood and worn out or ill-fitting contact lenses. Superficial foreign bodies—this is when a flying object gets into the eye, most dangerous is metal; subconjunctival hemorrhage occurs spontaneously and can be caused by a simple sneeze; and chemical conjunctivitis can be caused when products containing alkali or acid, such as hair dyes, drain cleaners, or bleach gets into the eyes. Eye protection is important especially when working with power tools, flush eyes with water for 10 to 20 minutes, see your doctor— and drink WINE!

Theodore Payne Foundation

The Theodore Payne Foundation was founded in 1960 to showcase the work of gardener Theodore Payne who came to the U.S. from England. The Foundation's mission is to preserve, propagate and promote California native plants, seeds and wildflowers. Native plants conserve water and other resources and provide for wildlife and add color and fragrance to gardens.

The Foundation operates one of the best retail nurseries for native plants and sells seeds out of drawers that are 113 years old. Their Education Center and Outreach programs offer classes and field trip for adults and children in K-12 grades. Garden tours are also offered—this year's tours are scheduled for April 1-2; 32 gardens are included in the tour. By gardening—we can save the world

It takes a staff of 17 full and part time staff members to run the Foundation, plus 200 volunteers. There are 3000 members. In 2015 the Foundation propagated 100,000 plants, 900 different native plants.
