ARROYO VERDE PARK PLAYGROUND



The City of Ventura's Parks & Recreation Director <u>Stacey</u>

<u>Zarazua</u> and Pacific Coast Land Design Principal <u>Eric Berg</u> spoke at our meeting April 17, 2024, about the award-winning inclusion playground at Arroyo Verde Park.

This innovative design idea had been formed before the Thomas Fire, but the destruction of the main play structure in the fire gave the city the opportunity to implement it.

Erik said, "Inclusivity is an ideal but there are always barriers in the world." To make it as inclusive as possible, they engaged the community to find their specific needs and included their ideas in the development.

The 10,750 square foot play area officially opened April 1, 2022. It includes spaces for physical, social, sensory and cognitive play, and a "quiet" area. The overall theme is a fort. The playground features a colorful play surface, new landscaping, gathering areas, swings, hammocks, balance beams, a sensory garden, a motion-inclusive carousel, embankment climbers, and music play areas. It also features a sensory wall with recognition tiles dedicated to those who donated to the project. It is the first installation in California that has the "ground piano" in the music area. Included are places of respite using elevated planters around sycamore trees for both kids and parents to rest.

The Arroyo Verde Park Inclusive Play Area received the 2021 Project of the Year Award from the Ventura County Chapter of the American Public Works Association (APWA) in the structures category for its safety performance, effective construction management, environmental considerations, and community outreach. It also won a national award for projects under 5 million dollars.








MEETING APRIL 17, 2024
