Program

Bob Cheatham presented a talk about the Devil Pups, a program begun in 1954 that provides teens from 14 – 17 an experience to test themselves beyond what they think they can do. Our own Larry Emrich is a past graduate.



The program was begun in 1954 by Duncan Shaw, Sr., a Marine who saw some boys burning an American flag and decided to create a program that would help kids on the wrong path turn their lives around.

He partnered with the Marines at Camp Pendleton to send kids there to a two-week Boot Camp. The program is a non-profit and uses no government funds. The name comes from a World War I name for Marines – the Devil Dogs. It is not a recruiting tool, however. ***Since 1954, 50,000 boys and girls have gone through the program.*** Its logo features Pluto, the famous Disney cartoon dog, and was given to the program by Walt Disney, himself.

The program is very motivational and seeks to push kids beyond what they think they can do, both physically and emotionally. They learn that respect is earned, not given. Tests include jumping into the pool from a 35 ft. platform and pre-dawn runs; it culminates with a climb up Old Smokey, a steep, gravel trail with an inspirational sunset finish. ***600 kids participate in two sessions each summer, staffed by real Marines who mean business!*** Bob stressed that this is not a program for really troubled youths; none can have a police record, for instance.

The cost per participant is \$451 for a two-week session, but all attend “on scholarship”, and the money is raised through private fundraising. ***Local tryouts for the Devil Pups will be Sunday, May 15th from 3-4 PM at the Ventura Community Park.*** Please speak to Bob Cheatham for more details about this excellent program.
