PRESENTATION – DISTRICT GOVERNOR SCOTT PHILLIPS

Our District Governor, Scott Phillips, addressed the club at our April 5 meeting.

Scott is the top official of Rotary District 5240, which includes 2,906 members in 69 clubs in Ventura, Santa Barbara, San Luis Obispo, and Kern Counties.

Scott discussed the importance of the comfort and care of our members. That includes checking up on members who have not attended recently. We should congratulate those members who get awards in their businesses.

It is also important to expand Rotary's reach. Wearing your Rotary pin outside of Rotary activities is a "conversation starter" that can attract new members. He recommended Rotarians spend more time in community activities and less time in meetings. Don't keep the gift of Rotary a secret!

For several years, Rotary International had 1.2 million members. We now include Rotaract members in our census, which brings us to 1.4 million. Our current International President, Jennifer E. Jones from Ontario, Canada, was the first female international president. She said, "In order to live in the kind of society you want, you need to build it."

Scott joined the Rotary Club of Goleta Noontime in 2013 and served as the club's president 2016-2017. He has served at the district level as Communications Director, Assistant Governor, Chief Operating Officer, District Administrator, President of the District's Charitable Foundation, and PRLS Director. He is the District's youngest governor. He is a multiple Paul Harris Fellow, Paul Harris Society member, Major Donor Level 2, member of the Bequest Society, PolioPlus Society, and a District 5240 Triple Crown Donor Charter member.

Scott is the CEO of Synergy Computing, Inc., an IT managed service provider in Santa Barbara. He is the author of the book *Hassle-Free Computer Support*. His second book, *39 Seconds: How to Protect Your Business Data, Customers, and Your Money from Cyberattacks that Occur Every 39 Seconds,* is due out soon. He enjoys traveling with Rotary friends and meeting new ones, photography, and amateur ham radio.
