Guests included Gary Young, soon to be the proud bearer of a red badge, and Albert Harris, the long-time better half of Rosalie Measures, who joined us for the second time in a row.

An early fine slip was presented to Prez Hutch because he forgot to tell PP Larry of the meeting location change (causing Larry to first go to the Derby Club); and Hutch graciously accepted the admonition.

The official **fining session**, by Jerry Beckerman, treated Club members to much more than the challenge to the riddles of the fining questions and brought us an opportunity to stop and consider what is important in this life. He focused on some of the highest wisdom mankind has produced, from Socrates to Martin Luther King, Jr.

Hank Chandler introduced our **program** presenters from the <u>Brain Injury Center of Ventura County</u>, led by its president David Wilk. David described the outstanding



work of the Center and offered a view into how many more people than we might imagine suffer from some form of brain injury. He noted that 16,000 people in Ventura County have a brain injury. John Davies, who

experienced a severe brain injury, shared with us his heartfelt path to recovery, and the distance still to go as was evident to us all. John was very competent in describing his path and evoking from us the genuine emotions as he described how the doctor initially told him that he may never speak or walk again. John explained how difficult it is to learn where to fit into society with this disability. A brain injury can happen in one second, but it lasts a lifetime. It's not like a broken arm -- a brain injury does not heal. New brain cells do not grow back to replace damaged ones. A brain injury can happen in a car accident, a sports collision, by falling off a horse or a ladder...or just by falling and hitting your head. It can come as the result of a high fever, heart attack or an infectious disease; every stroke is a brain injury. We were advised to take a number of Safety Measures to protect ourselves from brain injury and to take any brain injury seriously - see a doctor!

The Four Way Test – of the things we think, say and do:

Is it the TRUTH?
Is it FAIR to all concerned?
Will it build GOODWILL and better
FRIENDSHIPS?
Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?
