Meeting of August 10th, 2011 Offsite Event – Commemorative Air Force Museum, Camarillo *Reporter: Kristin Taylor*

Fifty-five members of the club and guests attended the offsite meeting at the Commemorative Air Force Museum in Camarillo on Wednesday, August 10. Attendees enjoyed an informative program and fascinating small group tours led by docents who are experts on WWII aviation.

Docents Jim Hinkelman, John Knopp and Charlie Carr conducted tours of the museum's unique and distinctive aircraft and of the hanger where the aircraft is restored and maintained. A delicious Italian lunch was catered by Buenaventura Catering.

Following a brief business meeting led by President Lynda Girtsman, Kristin Taylor introduced <u>Dr. John Woolley</u>, former Vice President of Student Services at Ventura College, long-time member of the Board of Directors of the Ventura College Foundation and Executive Officer and <u>Museum Director of the Commemorative Air Force, Southern California Wing</u>.



Colonel John Woolley, an authority on WWII aviation, spoke briefly of the origins of the museum and its goals for the future. He

announced fundraising plans to renovate the museum entrance and gift shop, resurface the hanger floor and create a temperature controlled environment for the display items and library areas. He explained that the goal of the restoration is to provide a facility that better serves the community while preserving history and military aviation.



The Commemorative Air Force received \$415.00 in donations from club members and guests. Colonel John Woolley and his fellow docents greatly appreciated our generosity and support. The Commemorative Air Force Museum is a treasure of our county. It has <u>one of the largest collections of</u> flying WWII aircraft of any aviation museum. The museum's impressive collection includes: <u>The F6F Grumman "Hellcat"</u>, single engine US naval fighter, was credited with destroying more Japanese aircraft than any other allied fighter. <u>A6M5 Mitsubishi "Zero"</u>, single engine Imperial Japanese naval fighter is one of only three (3) flying in the world. The "Zero" is the most famous and most produced Japanese aircraft of WW II.

<u>North American P-51</u>, single engine US Army Air Force (USAAF) fighter, is judged to be the best all-around fighter aircraft of WWII, it destroyed more German aircraft than any other US Aircraft.

<u>Vickers-Supermarine Mk. XIVe "Spitfire"</u>, single engine British Royal Air Force (RAF) fighter, gained fame in the Battle of Britain (7/10-10/31/1940).

<u>Curtiss C-46 "Commando",</u> twin engine USAAF transport plane, was the largest US twin-engine transport of WW II. It gained fame for transporting supplies to China from India over the Himalayan mountains (a.k.a "The Hump"). <u>F8F Grumman "Bearcat"</u>, single engine US Navy fighter, holds the world speed record for a piston -engine aircraft. <u>North American SNJ/AT-6 "Texan"</u>, single engine advanced training aircraft, was credited with training more pilots from 1939-1950 than any other aircraft. <u>North American PBJ/B-25</u> US twin-engine medium bomber was the most produced US medium bomber of WW II. It gained fame for the 4/16/42 Doolittle raid on Tokyo. This aircraft is being restored as a US Marine Corp patrol bomber.

<u>Yak 3 Russian</u> single engine fighter aircraft. It was the most produced fighter of WW II - 37,000. Anyone seeking further information regarding the Commemorative Air Force Museum/CAF can go to
