JANET BARRON: CASA



Janet Barron, Training Manager for Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Ventura County gave a presentation at our meeting August 16, 2023.

CASA has been serving youth in Ventura County since 1985. It is sometimes confused with Casa Pacifica, which serves some of the same population and, for a time, provided office space to CASA.

CASA serves abused and neglected youth in the juvenile dependency system. They are ages 0 to 21; most are 5 to 18. But increasing numbers are infants born addicted to drugs.

After they reach 18, youth can opt to remain in the juvenile system until age 21 ("extended foster care") and continue to receive CASA advocacy and other services. Since 2019, CASA also serves youth accused of delinquency in the juvenile justice system.

Last year, 229 advocates in Ventura County served 254 youth. Advocates come from many walks of life, including those in helping professions, empty nesters, those who were in the dependency system as children, and those interested in the law. Most advocates are women but 42 are male and more male advocates are needed. There is a waiting list of 237 youth.

CASA began when Judge David W. Soukup in Seattle asked community members to provide him information about the kids to help him make decisions in juvenile cases. There are now CASA programs in every county in California, and in every state in the country EXCEPT North Dakota (go figure)! CASA of Ventura is a 501(c)(3) non-profit.

Volunteers are interviewed, and their background and references are checked. After receiving 40 hours of training, they are sworn in by the juvenile court judge as officers of the court. The main requirements are compassion and liking kids.

CASA volunteers meet with their appointee weekly. They can share a snack, work on homework, or go on expeditions to the theater or pumpkin patch. They have access to the juvenile's file, attend the child's court hearings, and write reports the court considers in making decisions.
