Mark Watkins, Ventura City Manager

Today's speaker is the recently hired Ventura City Manager, whom the Ventura City Council unanimously named on February 11, 2013. Watkins comes to the City with nearly thirty years of local government experience.

Mark brings a unique combination of education, professional experience and familiarity with issues facing Ventura. As a longtime resident he understands the community and local challenges.

"Mark is truly dedicated improving city government through accountability and transparency. We have a lot of work to do and I look forward to working with him," said Mayor Mike Tracy.



Mr. Watkins was selected from a field of over 38 applicants through an open competitive recruitment process.

"This is an extraordinary opportunity for me professionally. It's really a homecoming since I've lived in Ventura for 25 years and raised my family in town," said Watkins.

Mr. Watkins, has worked for the City of Thousand Oaks, CA since 2001. He served as the Deputy Public Works Director/City Engineer for four years and Public Works Director for seven years. Prior to his position in Thousand Oaks, CA, he served as the Maintenance Services Manager for the City of Ventura and Civil Engineer for Kern County. Mr. Watkins holds a Master's Degree in Public Administration from Cal. State Univ., Northridge and a Bachelor's Degree in Civil Engineering from Cal. State University, Chico.

The City of Ventura is a full-service Charter City with a Council-Manager form of government. The City Manager is appointed by the City Council and is responsible to the City Council for the administration of all City affairs



placed in his charge by or under the City Charter.

Under the Charter adopted by the citizens of Ventura in 1934, the City Manager is "the administrative head of the City government . . . responsible to the City Council for the administration of all City affairs" including hiring and firing department heads, preparing the annual budget and ensuring the effective implementation of the City Council's policies and priorities.

The City Manager advises Council on strategic direction for the City and responding to changing community needs. Most of all, the City Manager provides overall organizational leadership to ensure the effective daily delivery of services, projects and programs.
