### Craft Talks Continued:

Mario de la Piedra is a 1987 graduate of Fillmore High School; he attended Ventura College and San Diego State University. A black belt in karate, he was also a star football player at both institutions, until a leg injury ended his sports career. He graduated from San Diego State with a BS in Political Science.



Mario grew up with Rotary's commitment to Service Above Self (his father is a past president of RC Fillmore Sunrisers). As a youngster, he started the "pennies for pencils" project to raise money for school supplies: he attended RYLA and after college traveled to

many poverty-stricken countries to explore solutions, including South Africa, India, Ghana and Vietnam. As a member of our club's International Service committee he will have an opportunity to draw on these experiences to help end poverty in some of these countries.

Having grown up in Fillmore, Mario has a strong connection with agriculture. That's why he decided to make a career with Barkley Insurance, who's niche market is agriculture.

Betsy Chess was also born into and raised in local agriculture. She recalls a wonderful childhood in Santa Paula in the 40s and 50s, living on a citrus farm, learning to ride horses, and being active in 4H.



Drawing on her own family roots, including her great-grandfather who came to the area from Maine as a "late goldrusher", she provided a colorful history of the various stages of agriculture

in Ventura County, from the sugar beet crops early on to oranges, lemons and strawberries.

While strawberries have been the leading crop for the past few years, there is no "demise of citrus" on the horizon, even as invasive pests threaten the citrus crops. Many of us did not know that Ventura County is the largest producer of vegetable seed in the country and that nursery stock is the county's third largest crop (the second largest being vegetables). She informed us that Ventura County ranks as 9th highest agricultural production county in California.

Reflecting on her professional career, first as editor of the Farm Bureau's publication "The Broadcaster" and then the Central Coast "Farm and Ranch" magazine, Betsy has found the nexus between art (writing) and agriculture!
