Married 33 years with two grown children, a third generation Japanese American and survivor of childhood polio, Wade has been on 17 Rotary mission trips and currently serves our District of 72 clubs as Governor. All of this while he manages his own landscaping business.

Wade shared some of his experiences since he joined Rotary just nine years ago. **Rotary touched his life in three special ways.**

1) When the Carpinteria Morning Club adopted a Water Project in Mexico, they needed someone with bilingual capabilities. Wade volunteered and **helped to bring safe drinking water and life to a poor village** where 80% of their children were sick from the bad water. **continued**
