Meeting July 28, 2010 District Governor Deepa Willingham's Visit

District 5240 Governor Deepa Willingham's visit to our club started Tuesday night with a lovely <u>reception at the newly re-opened Museum of Ventura County</u>. The Gov arrived in her special "Stop Polio Now" car and spent most of her time meeting and greeting club



members and guests, including several Rotaractors. Thanks to the efforts of co-chairs Rosa Lee Measures and Tim Schiffer, everyone enjoyed a delicious dinner, a variety of beverages and great fellowship. Governor Deepa, who is known for her share of unorthodox "firsts", added yet another one for D. 5240 by performing the first induction of a new member at a Governor's reception. Ken Cooper. a "local boy" was pinned and received his "red badge of courage" from the Governor, with President Hutch happy to assist as Ken's sponsor.



Governor Deepa's passion for educating girls in impoverished countries to help families and communities improve their lives was underscored in her brief talk which was accompanied by a poignant video clip. Tim presented the Governor with a book on Santa Clara Valley/Ventura County.

<u>Wednesday's club meeting</u> opened with flag salute, invocation and introductions by Doug Halter and a rousing God Bless America led by the song meister trio of Tim Spencer, Clyde Reynolds and RoseAnn Hill.



Announcements included Ellyn Dembowski asking for support of the backpack project, Larry Emrich modeling the new End Polio shirts and Prez Hutch pleading for members to ride in the Ventura County Fair Parade with him.

Governor Deepa assisted President Hutch in inducting another new member into our club (see picture above). She is <u>Kathy Wertheim</u>, sponsored by Steve Kipp. Gov. Deepa told Kathy that the club welcomed her as a member of Rotary "but only you can become a Rotarian".

District Governor Deepa. He briefly touched on her upbringing in India, where she was a pupil of Mother Teresa's, the values imparted to her by her family ("no human being is below you"), her many awards and accomplishments and her passion for educating young women with the goal of eradicating poverty. Governor Deepa followed this with her self-introduction as "one crazy Indian woman with a hole in her head" (referring to her recent surgery). Before she embarked on her speech, she made a special presentation to Mario de la Piedra, who was selected by the club to receive a Paul



Governor Deepa's message emphasized that Rotary has been humanity's problem solver for the past 100+ years and that our planet's future well-being will be in the hands of Rotary. She reminded us that half the world's population earns less than \$2 a day and that 600 Mill. children live in such poverty; one half of the world's population is illiterate and 2/3 of them are women. These people, living in extreme poverty, have no voice or control over their lives. and no hope to sustain life. Even in our own country, currently 700,000 children go to bed hungry every night, which is a 50% increase over the prior four years. Gov. Deepa reminded us again that we cannot relent in our humanitarian efforts of "building communities and bridging continents" (R I President Klinginsmith' theme). Governor Deepa called on Barbara Asbell and Ed Campbell to share what Rotary means to them. She concluded her remarks by asking us to continue "operating from the heart" and charged us to become more visible in the community by doing more hands-on, high profile projects.
