speaker. Geoff is a lifetime resident of California. Born in Los Angeles and raised in Simi Valley, he has lived in Camarillo for the past 18 years, where he has been a Rotarian.



Geoff is a 32-year veteran of the Ventura County Sheriffs Department. Prior to being elected as the 19th Sheriff of Ventura County he commanded three of the four divisions within the Sheriffs Department. Sheriff Dean has worked varied assignments throughout the Department including commanding the SWAT Team, Chief of Police for the City of Moorpark and overseeing Internal Affairs.

Geoff spoke of the restructuring of the administrative hierarchy of the Sheriff's Department, both as a means of increasing the efficiency of the department and as a means of meeting tightening budgets without a reduction of front line forces. The Sheriff also outlined the numerous services provided to the unincorporated areas of Ventura County as well as the three county cities that choose to use the Sheriff for law enforcement duties. The Sheriff also operates the county jail system.

Dr. Virginia Bentley has been a psychotherapist for over 30 years. She has a degree in English literature from UCSB and a Doctorate in psychology from Oregon School of Professional Psychology. Dr. Bentley was founder and director of an anxiety treatment clinic in San Francisco for many years. After moving to Santa Barbara, she expanded her knowledge, focusing on the connection between anxiety, depression, illness and trauma.

In 2008, she traveled to the Congo, where women continue to be terrorized by gang rape and torture; she started a vocational training/rehabilitation program that treats women and girl victims of sexual violence. Dr. Bentley now runs two non-profit organizations – *Empower Congo Women* in Santa Barbara and *Ushindi Center* in Bukavu, Eastern Congo.


