GROWING WORKS



Jenn Rodriguez, manager of Turning Point Foundation's Growing Works program, gave a presentation at our meeting February 14, 2024.

Growing Works provides recovery services in a horticultural environment for adults with moderate to severe mental health diagnoses. They operate a wholesale and retail nursery in Camarillo growing California Native plants, succulents, and 10 percent "fun plants." The plants are all grown in pots, including the popular four-inch pots starting at \$5.90, and larger 1 to 15 gallon pots. The facility neighbors a number of residential mental health programs.

Growing Works members are individuals who receive professional medical services and "own" their mental health diagnosis. After volunteering at least 108 hours, taking a job preparedness class, and developing a wellness recovery action plan, they can progress to paid supportive employees. The recovery services provided include developing coping skills such as learning a new skill, exercise, journaling, and mindfulness practices. Members' duties depend on their abilities and interests. For individuals who have faced many challenges in their lives, Growing Works allows them to celebrate victories.







The parent organization, Turning Point Foundation, operates 14 programs in 11 locations. It provides "compassionate and proactive treatment for adults struggling with mental illness."




MEETING FEBRUARY 14, 2024

February 21 lunch meeting: Rhett Mauck, National Disaster Search Dog Foundation. Founded in 1996, the National Disaster Search Dog Foundation (SDF) is a nonprofit, non-governmental organization based in Santa Paula, CA. SDF strengthens disaster response in America by producing highly skilled canine disaster search teams to search for missing persons and victims of natural and manmade disasters. SDF is the oldest nonprofit organization in the U.S. that recruits rescued dogs, gives them ongoing professional training, and partners them with firefighters and other first responders nationwide. SDF offers this life-saving resource at no cost to fire departments or task forces, providing emergency response personnel with a critically important asset they could not otherwise afford.



No technology can match a dog's speed and accuracy in finding people trapped in the wreckage of a disaster, thanks to a remarkable sense of smell, the ability to ignore all other scents and noises when searching, and an unparalleled ability to quickly and safely navigate unstable and slippery terrain.

SDF has trained over 200 certified teams that have deployed to 264 disasters and missing person searches. There are currently 91 SDF-trained search teams located in California, Florida, Nebraska, New York, Oklahoma, Texas, Utah, Virginia, and Baja California. Thanks to mutual aid agreements, these teams can be deployed wherever disasters occur.

Rhett Mauck, Executive Director, was born and raised in Ventura County, Rhett graduated from San Diego State University before returning to the area to find an organization that allowed him to follow his true passion: rescuing dogs and giving them a renewed purpose in life.

Rhett joined the SDF team in 2009 as the Development Manager before advancing to Senior Director of Philanthropy. In that role, Rhett guided all fundraising efforts and strengthened donor engagement by nurturing opportunities to increase the impact of our supporters' philanthropic objectives. He also contributed substantively to developing the capital fundraising campaign to build the facilities and then transition SDF to the National Training Center campus. Rhett had the opportunity to be involved strategically in SDF's program and organizational areas through the years before assuming the Executive Director role in 2022.

Alongside SDF's dynamic and passionate staff, Rhett oversees day-to-day operations and explores innovative ways to further the goals and tangible outcomes of our work. He continues to be inspired and motivated by the SDF team's ability to focus the natural abilities of rescued, high-drive canines into impactful work to change the world through the power of the human-canine bond. Rhett is often accompanied at work by Roscoe, his Pitbull/Lab mix, who was adopted from the Humane Society of Ventura County.
