Announcements:

We were reminded by Pres Hutch that this is Rotary Awareness Month as he opened the meeting to announcements. RoseAnn Hill was first to the microphone to report that the Gold Coast Ride for Literacy posters are now available for the club members to post around the area and at their businesses. Chris Brashears put in a plug for the Project Understanding canned food drive, and Margo Burns confirmed the team members that volunteered for the final week of Dictionary deliveries to 3rd grade kids in Ventura.

The winner of the Rotaract Vespa Moped drawing was then announced, and as member Dave Wallace received his prize, we found out that Dave was rather serious about this and purchased three of the 112 tickets sold. This quick project brought in \$4,480 to Rotaract and provided a good example of how to conceive of and implement a novel and successful fundraiser. Pres Hutch then recalled how surprised he was recently to find a box with a Paul Harris pin that had two rubies on it. Not recognizing this arrangement (yes, it is very rare!) he had to research on online to find out that it represented eight Fellowships. With everyone on the edge of their seat, he asked Larry Emrich to come forward and receive this his eighth Paul Harris Fellowship. The club erupted a boisterous standing ovation as past president and Polio eradication advocate, Larry, received this well deserved honor.

Program:

Melissa Sayer (pictured), our presenter, gave a highly informative account of our <u>local agricultural history</u>. What started as cattle farming in the 1860's, was transformed by drought into grain farming in the 1870's, and then broadened to other crops with the help of the early California Missions, is now a billion dollar plus industry.



It was interesting to hear the sequence of food crops that have come and gone as the economics and politics of the times kept changing. And the "how it started" stories were fun. Some interesting agricultural statistics for 2009 are: 100K acres harvested; 31K jobs; 100 types of food grown, 5% of harvest was "organic".

With her legal and business background, Melissa provided a slightly different perspective than what we are used to hearing. There were many "ah ha" moments as we stitched together past facts with her added historical background. Today California's agriculture still has water and regulation issues, global competition challenges, and new threats from evolving pests, but this reporter came away with a little more confidence that local agriculture businesses will continue to adapt and survive for a long time to come.
