
NATIONAL DISASTER SEARCH DOG FOUNDATION



Rhett Mauck, Executive Director of the National Disaster Search Dog Foundation (SDF), gave a presentation at our meeting February 21, 2024. SDF was founded in 1996 by Ojai resident Wilma Melville and has now trained almost 300 teams in the United States and Baja California.

The dogs are often rescued from animal shelters, but the rescued then become the rescuers. The search teams locate victims of natural and manmade disasters, including the Oklahoma City bombing, World Trade Center attack, earthquakes in Japan, Nepal, Haiti, and many more.

The dogs receive nine months of training at the National Training Center in Santa Paula, and are recertified every three years. It costs about \$60,000 to train and certify a team. The foundation is funded completely by private donations.


Club Service: Please let Madhu know if an event will conflict with our planned events.

No meeting at Poinsettia Pavilion that day--our previously scheduled speaker, Dave Armstrong, is rescheduled for April 3.




UPCOMING EVENTS
