PROGRAM—JACQUELYN GARGANO RONALD McDONALD HOUSE

Jacquelyn Gargano, Director of the Ronald McDonald Family Room at Ventura County Medical Center (VCMC), gave a presentation at our meeting January 11, 2023. Critically ill children may be in the hospital for months, and Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC) helps their families stay close to them while they receive treatment. RMHC provides comfort, care, and a sense of hope.



RMHC has 265 family rooms in 25 countries and regions. VCMC has the first family room that is not under the umbrella of a House, which means it must fund and operate itself. It is also the first family room in California to partner with a public hospital.

The family room is for children receiving care at the hospital and their families to relax while remaining close to the child's hospital bedside. They can receive a hot meal, a snack, coffee, a juice box, and do laundry for free. Volunteers do "rounds" each day to introduce the program to families and see how they can help. Since the room opened in September 2022, it has served over 250 families.

There are two separate spaces in the hospital. One is a large space that formerly housed the Homer Auditorium. There is a quiet room with eight beds. VCMC provided the space, but the rooms required extensive renovations and earthquake retrofitting. They are currently open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. The goal is for both rooms to be open 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., seven days a week. More volunteers are needed to make this possible. To volunteer or for more information, contact JGargano@rmhcsc.org

February 8 lunch meeting—Annual fundraiser for Ventura High School Interact.




