Roz Warner introduced our speaker Sheriff Geoff Dean, 32-year Ventura County veteran and the 19th Sheriff of Ventura County, who talked about the prisoner re-alignment program.



Re-alignment is interesting and controversial. It represents a significant change. State had 33,000 too many inmates and a suit was lodged saying healthcare was not adequate. State Supreme Court said population must be reduced by 30,000. Two choices 1.

Release 30,000 back into the community or ...? The decided solution was to repatriate all non-violent felons back into the County Jail System beginning in October 2011. No cap was set on the amount of prisoners who could be moved so County jails are experiencing a huge influx of prisoners. Ventura County saw an increase of 260 inmates in the first six months

of the program and anticipates that over the next 30 months that number will be 430 inmates. Current capacity can accommodate 350 of those.

What does this mean? Many non-violent felons will be released back into the community instead of being arrested. Electronic monitoring of convicted felons is another option.

The number of parolees in the VC system (1900) will not increase, but now will be overseen by County probation officers. However, 50% of the cost now will be picked up by the State.



Sheriff Dean said that most of our inmates are in for six years or less. Some other counties are getting longer termers. Jails are not designed for long-term care and problems. Health care and attendant costs are a huge issue. For instance, due to State regulations, prisoners

cannot be given generic drugs. (Huge groan from the audience!) Another problem is the "sophistication" of long-term inmates = much harder to guard.

In 30 months Ventura County will accrue an additional \$2.7 million in increased costs. State is supposed to repay us (another huge groan). The law allows for prisoners to be transferred to other cities that have capacity, but it prohibits the use private contractors. Sheriff Dean reassured us that "the sky is not falling", but it looks to this reporter that some rainy days are ahead.
