

CONGRESSMAN SALUD CARBAJAL



Congressman Salud Carbajal addressed the club at our meeting January 24, 2024. He was the youngest of seven children. He came to the United States at 5 years old when his father was a fieldworker in the Bracero program. His father then got a great job in a copper mine in Arizona. When the mine closed, Salud and his family moved to the La Colonia neighborhood in Oxnard.

Salud worked hard in school and was employed summers as a farmworker. He earned a bachelor's degree from UCSB and a master's degree in Organizational Management from the Fielding University. He served eight years in the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve including active duty in Jacksonville, N.C. during the Gulf War.

When a Santa Barbara County Supervisor hired him as chief of staff, Salud learned about government, running for office, public policy, and what government can do. Carbajal ran for the seat when the supervisor retired and served four terms. He was first elected to the House of Representatives in 2016 and is now in his fourth term. Like all members of the House, he must run for office every two years. (Can you imagine doing that??)

Congressman Carbajal believes in working beyond our differences and, when possible, works across the aisle in Congress. He is a member of the Problem Solvers Caucus, which has equal numbers of Democrats and Republicans. He discussed a number of the bills he has sponsored.

Congressman Carbajal commented that Rotary provides "ladders of opportunity" by providing coats, financial assistance, and services. He believes that Congress could learn from the Rotarians in our community.

This is the first time I heard Congressman Carbajal speak. I appreciated getting to know about him as a person and what issues he believes are important. I assume not all members of our politically diverse club share all his views. But because his district includes most of the City of Ventura, he represents many of us in Congress, and it was a good opportunity to learn about the bills he has sponsored.

BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

The Rotary Club of Ventura Board of Directors met on Thursday, January 25, 2024, at the Crowne Plaza. Starting this month, the **Board Agenda and Minutes** will be sent out via email with the newsletter. The Board approved a schedule of exciting **speakers and programs** for our noontime meetings from February through May. They are listed on our website.

Neal Lassila will continue on as **President** for the 2024-2025 Rotary year unless someone else steps up. **Joslynn Skelton** is slated to serve as President for 2025-2026.

The **Fireworks event** is moving forward, with the pyrotechnics contract "in hand." The **Sponsorship Committee** is already meeting, and additional members are encouraged to join.

The Board approved a much-changed version of the **Beachside Bash** for Sept. 28, 2024. Incorporating lessons learned from this year's event, the plan is to get a caterer or a group like the Lions to have a barbeque (no food trucks), and to hire a well-known musical act. No car show, fewer volunteers, and a different location.

Neal Lassila has been attending the **Ventura Chamber of Commerce** on behalf of the club. Ken Leandro will take over. Kellye Patterson spearheaded a **Young Rotarians** meeting (club members age 49 or below) and plans to do it again quarterly.

Our club will co-sponsor the Albania/Romania International Project to provide ophthalmology and other medical equipment to Lezha (Albania) Regional Hospital. The project is sponsored by the Rotary Club of Lezha, the Cambria Rotary Club, and the Santa Maria Breakfast Rotary. We are not required to commit funds to the project but may do so later.

All the **Perspectives on Peace** entries will be displayed at the Crowne Plaza on April 18, with everyone welcome to attend. The judges will meet later that evening to select the winners. Awards will be given at our luncheon meeting May 22.

In response to member suggestions, we will test changes in our **monthly meeting schedule** in March and April—three luncheon meetings and one evening meeting. We'll see how it goes!

A **Rise Against Hunger** event is scheduled for April 24, with all Ventura Interact clubs participating (Ventura, Foothill, Pacific, Buena, and Bonaventure).

After discussion of the **Dictionary Project**, it was agreed that it will proceed with no Board vote needed because the funds have already been budgeted. Dictionaries (which also include reference material) will be given to about 900 Ventura third graders at a cost of about \$3,700.

Discussion of taking over the Chalk Art Festival, Sept. 9-10. No action taken.
