To begin the meeting, Dave Loe recounted the origins of the Four Way Test before reciting it for us. Clyde Reynolds led us in "It's a Grand Old Flag."

President Irene announced that all the places are filled for the Labyrinth wine tasting event January 30 from 5:30 -7:00 pm. She then asked for members to save the date for the polio fundraiser coming up to honor Larry Emrich. (See the article on today's front page.) Kristin Taylor announced that coats are still coming in and she needs help: from volunteers to determine where the best collection sites were located. Ron Calkins gave an update on the Fourth of July activities. They are close to determining the feasibility of expanding the event. He also asked for members to step up to leadership roles in various tasks needed to put on a successful effort.

The balance of the meeting became a sort of 'Mario de la Piedra Day' with a succession of awards given to him. Dave Loe emceed the occasion, first calling up Presidentelect Rob vanNieuwburg who presented Mario with the absurdly prestigious Golden Weenie award. Next up was Mario's father, Mario Sr. and his wife, Virginia. Mario Sr., longtime Rotarian in Fillmore, spoke of his son before presenting Mario Jr. with his fourth Paul Harris Fellowship. Program

Steve Kipp introduced the speaker, Mike Powers, who has served as the CEO of the County of Ventura since 2011. He was born and raised in Ventura, where he resides with his wife Erin, and sons Charlie and Zackary

Powers oversees some 8,400 employees in 26 departments and is responsible for overseeing and supporting all major county functions and services including budget, finance, legislation, human resources, labor relations, economic development and information technology.

He is proud to say that Ventura County has a balanced budget of \$1.8 billion which has been achieved with lower overhead, waste-cutting while still providing more essential services. The county holds a AAA bond rating.

A big concern for the County is the continuing mandated "Safety Realignment" which has seen 660 convicted persons from the County facilities released to date, with another 801 projected to be released soon. The sheriffs department is collaborating closely with the incorporated cities to maintain communication on this and other county-wide matters.


