which he and his wife, Cindy began three years ago.



John started the program by playing an amazing presentation of bird-like music on his <u>Hawaiian nose flute.</u> He explained that he decided to use the flute in his program because almost every country has a mythology that includes flutes.

Children in the program learn not only about music, but they also learn to make and decorate their own flute. In fact, the <u>kids make two instruments – one to keep and</u> <u>one to give away – a lesson in being a giving and</u> <u>compassionate person.</u>

The instruments are then given to a "flute friend". So far <u>John's program has gone to the Philippines, Honduras</u> <u>and Haiti.</u> He is in the process of getting his 501c3 status and hopes to greatly expand his outreach.



The flute's mellow, organic tones and long history seems to resonate in unexpected ways, including <u>being a part of</u> <u>Operation Smile and Operation</u> <u>Footprint</u>, whose patients are soothed through the ordeal of their surgeries to correct cleft

pallets and club feet. Flutes for these children came from their "flute friends" at Ronald McDonald camps.

The program was remarkable and inspiring – a fitting send off into the upcoming New Year.
