The Hotel

The main vessel was 125' long and included 27 rooms and private baths, a hot tub, washer and dryer and other amenities. In addition to the six swimmers, some family accompanied them plus a 9-person film crew, 4 official observers, a reporter from the Star and a few others. In the water

Although they followed the coastline, their course was as much as 25 miles off of land. The swimmers were guided in the water with their Zodiac boat which had guidance equipment on it. The water temperature was particularly cold for two days, getting down to 54 degrees at one point. No wet suits are allowed for this competition. Shark protection was available with a "shark shield" which acts like a Taser to the sharks. They had a problem with jellyfish and Jim experienced flesh-eating fish at night! Challenges

Their relay rotation was to swim one hour every six hours. The number one problem was getting enough sleep. After getting out of the cold water, the swimmer had to warm their body, then eat, which left only about three hours for sleep. They had a dispute with the boat's captain. All we know is they completed the journey on the same boat. Before the swim

They had agreed as a team to have no negative discussions between them. No complaining. The result was they built a very strong team, both physically and mentally.

After the swim

They have had magazine articles, interviews and more. Swimmer magazine's interviewer asked the question, "What secrets did you not tell your teammates before than you can tell now?" which resulted in some poignant Team members were from 40-60 years of age:

Mike Shaffer, 45. Fastest on the team. A tri-athlete.

Jim Neitz had made great improvements in swimming.

John Chung, 40. The stallion.

Tom Ball, 51, owns a Karate studio Kurt Baron, 46, and Jim McConica, 60. Jim's messages for us

- We earn the right to perform well. We do this every single day, in everything we do.
- **Get your mind right.** This axiom ties into the goal of getting rid of negative thoughts. Your body will follow your mind. This is especially true in sports.
- "We are what we repeatedly do. Excellence, therefore, is not an act but a habit." This quote from Aristotle is printed on Jim's business card.
