grow three varieties – Cabernet Sauvignon, Syrah and Merlot.

Larry said "great wine is made in the vineyard"; he went on to list all the elements that must be attended to before the first grape is picked: water, topography, temperature, site orientation, what to plant, what clones to use? Then the soil must be prepared, deer fencing.

and the irrigation installed, trellises designed and installed. The varieties are then planted, first the Cab followed by the Syrah and the Merlot.

The tasks of Spring – watering, pest and bird control, leaf pulling, fruit culling, are followed by the Fall harvest where timing is of the essence.

Once the right sugar to acid balance is reached, the grapes should be picked within 24 hours. After that the fruit will begin to lose water and weight. Since the grower is paid on weight, the longer the fruit hangs, the less he is paid. The contractors hold the power and either send out picking crews right away if they have capacity, or allow the fruit to hang if they do not.

The Rasmussens <u>can produce up to 40 tons of grapes</u>, <u>but only keep enough to bottle 300 – 500 cases</u> <u>themselves</u>. The rest of the fruit is sold to brokers. Larry showed pictures of the first harvest when friends and family did the picking and crushing. Like all of wine making, the process of fermentation, storage and bottling is complex and critical.

Larry said after the frenzy of the Fall come the cool months of Winter, when the vines color, drop their leaves and are pruned. Then ... Spring, and the whole process begins again!
