### Meeting July 7, 2010

Displayed throughout the meeting space were the many banners, both domestic and international, collected from the clubs visited by our members, and flowers accenting each table.



The meeting was expeditiously called to order promptly at 12:30 pm by President Hutch, who then turned it over to Indy Batra to lead us in the flag

salute and an invocation that helped members focus on their "next breath". Clyde Reynolds, Jim Spencer and RoseAnn Hill led us in the patriotic song. After guests were introduced, the meeting was resumed by President Hutch who immediately welcomed Jim Deardorff to the podium to begin the announcements. Jim proudly listed the members with perfect attendance for the past year, highlighting Hoot Bennett's 54 years of membership and 54 years of perfect attendance.
