She serves on the City of Ventura's General Plan Advisory Committee (GPAC), is on the board of The City Center, is an active member of the City of Ventura's Homeless Stakeholder Committee, served as the 2017 Chair of FOOD Share's CAN-Tree and was recognized in 2018 as one of the Top 50 Women in Business by the Pacific Coast Business Times. Stephanie has two adult children and 3 grandchildren.

Dena Rogers has been an independent contractor State Farm Agent in Ventura since 1991. In this role, Dena helps customers manage risk and recover from the unexpected.
