SHELTERBOX NEWS - HAITI

Since our club has contributed a number of shelter boxes over the past year, this excerpt from a news report on the ShelterBox website will show the impact of our donations and the work of the organization.

ShelterBox's response to the Haiti earthquake has been the biggest, longest and most complex in the 10-year history of the international disaster relief charity. The first ShelterBox response team was mobilized 12 minutes after the earthquake struck. Now, six months later, 22,191 ShelterBoxes have been delivered in Haiti, enough aid for more than 220,000 people.



Staff, volunteers and supporters the world over have worked tirelessly with dedication, passion and commitment to deliver emergency shelter and life-saving supplies to thousands of Haitian

families. Wherever you look in Port-au-Prince you can see a SherlterBox tent. "This wouldn't have been possible without the overwhelming generosity of our donors.
