Judith Hale Norris was the speaker at our July 27 meeting. Her father, Allan Hale, was the first Chief Justice of the Massachusetts Appeals Court. He taught her an important lesson: treat everyone, friend or adversary, with respect. After she earned her law degree from Boston University School of Law, she because an Assistant U.S. Attorney in Massachusetts. She took her father's advice with her, honoring the positions of everyone involved in each case.

Judith's husband, Bill, was in the Coast Guard and was transferred to Washington, D.C. Judith went with him and was hired as Chief Staff Counsel at the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia. During her job interview, the Notorious RBG (Ruth Bader Ginsburg) was silent for long periods before speaking. Judith learned that RBG always thought carefully before she spoke. Judith ended up taking Jazzercize classes with RBG and was treated to meals cooked by her husband, Marty Ginsburg. RBG gave Judith some advice to a happy marriage: sometimes you've got to be a little bit deaf!

Anotonin Scalia was also a judge on the court, and like RBG, he later became a Supreme Court Justice. He had a great sense of humor and always called her "Judy, Judy, Judy." Ken Starr was called "The Baby Judge" because he was only 37 years old when appointed to the D.C. Circuit. (He later went on to investigate Monica Lewinsky, but that's another story…)

Judith was recently selected as a Rotary Clubs of Ojai Living Treasure. Her presentation gave us a fascinating inside look at the personalities on the highest courts of our land.

Jordan Harrison presented at our July 20 meeting. He earned his B.S. in marketing from San Diego State, and his Master's in education from Harvard University. His is a member of San Diego Rotary Club, a professional speaker, DEI (Diversity Equity Inclusion) consultant, and international youth development specialist. He is Vice President of Community Impact and Partnerships at Reality Changers.

Jordan demonstrated his theme of Hear Here through an exercise: members paired up, asked each other "How are you?", and really listened to the answers. He shared a video of Beyonce singing I Was Here at the August 19, 2012 World Humanitarian Day: "One day, one message, one goal. To inspire people all over the world to do something good, no matter how big or small, for someone else." He discussed Equality versus Equity verses Liberation. Diversity is not the destination—belongingness is. He ended with constructing a poem based on the contributions of those in attendance that demonstrated our power to deal with adversity. That evening, **Doug Halter** and **Randy Encinas** hosted reception for Jordan Harrison at their beautiful home in the Ventura hills.
