

VUSD Superintendent Dr. Trudy Tuttle Arriaga

Dr. Trudy Tuttle Arriaga returns for a final time as Ventura Unified School District Superintendent. She is leaving her position this summer after 14 years. She will speak to us about, "A look back at VUSD, a glance of the present VUSD and a glimpse into the future of VUSD."

A life-long resident of Ventura, Dr. Arriaga attended VUSD schools, ultimately graduating from Ventura High School in

1973. Dr. Arriga holds a B.A. in Communicative Disorders from San Diego State University, an M.A. in Educational Administration and Supervision from California State University Northridge, and an Ed.D. in Educational Policy, Planning and Administration from the University of Southern California.

She began working for the district as a paraeducator in 1975. In 1981, Dr. Arriaga began her teaching career in Grades 3 through Adult in Special



Education, Migrant Education, and Adult Education. Since then, she has served as Assistant Principal at DeAnza, Principal at Sheridan Way, Principal at El Camino and Pacific High Schools and Director of Administrative Support Services. She is the superintendent first woman of the Ventura Unified School District, the third largest district in Ventura County. She was selected by the Pepperdine University Graduate School of

Education and Psychology as the recipient of the 2010 Superintendent of the Year Award. and is also a recipient of the Region 13 Superintendent of the Year award for 2009.

Dr. Arriaga is married to Raymundo Arriaga, and has two daughters. She enjoys reading, jogging, guitar, music, mentoring and traveling. She also continues to enjoy teaching education courses at the university level. She is a Paul Harris Fellowhip recipient.

Brenda Birdwell was our speaker from the Santa Barbara branch of the Braille Institute. She serves as Field Services Manager, serving the tri-county Central Coast with outreach and communications.

She shared a brief history about her organization. Louis Braille was Frenchman, born with normal vision. But an accident and then an infection took his eyesight. Ever resourceful and determined to continue reading, at age 14 Braille adapted a military code based on the tactile sense to avoid having sensitive information overheard. Thus 100 years ago, the Braille alphabet was created.

The Institute continues to teach Braille, even though new 'smart' devices are helping low-vision persons with adaptive technology. The Institute serves more than the completely blind: in fact 90% of clients have some sight. One of the main goals is to teach independent living skills: Helping people with low vision to lead empowered lives

Polio Gains in Pakistan

The Pakistani army's nearly yearlong campaign against Islamist militants in the northern tribal belt has its skeptics, but one area where experts say its effect has been unmistakable is in battling polio.

Six cases have been reported this year in the Federally Administered Tribal Areas, down from 56 in the same period last year. In October, a quarter-million children could not be reached by vaccination teams; the number dropped to 47,000 by May.

Health authorities and relief officials credit improved security in the tribal areas since an army offensive against the Pakistani Taliban, which opposes polio vaccinations because it alleges they are a cover for Western espionage. In past years, militants routinely attacked health workers carrying out vaccination drives, along with their security teams, killing dozens. The army provided advance warning of the offensive, which began last June, allowing residents as well as militants time to flee the tribal belt. As people have returned to towns and villages cleared by army operations, vaccination teams have resumed their work with greater access to areas once seen as off-limits.

Pakistan is one of only three countries, along with Nigeria and Afghanistan, where polio remains endemic. Of the 24 cases reported this year, all but one have been in Pakistan, according to the Global Polio Eradication Initiative.
