Program

The Ventura Boys and Girls Club, presented by Dr. Jamshid Damooei, Ph. D. Professor of Economics at CLU

Dr. Damooei presented detailed research he did that shows the positive impact of the Boys and Girls Club in Ventura County.



He generalized that the work of the club generates economic growth and tax revenue, saves government expenditure (government agencies including police do not have to get involved in negative activities), supports family income (keeping

kids busy and out of trouble, and lets parents get better education or maintain jobs), and creates a better future for boys and girls in the county. He stressed that, "There is a clear social cost if we disinvest in our community." Evidence supports that organizations like the Boys and Girls Club help lower teen pregnancy, reduce teen crime, reduce obesity and related diseases, and strengthen and promote teen volunteerism.

The Boys and Girls Club serves almost 13,000 families each year in Ventura County. Dr. Damooei highlighted figures in various charts that showed a great return on the money invested. He said that each dollar invested brings back \$11.72.

Final Thoughts by Hutch: Henry Ford said, "Nothing is particularly hard if you divide it into small jobs."
