
July 12 lunch meeting: President Neal Lassila's kick-off meeting with inspirational words from Ventura local John Silva.

LARRY PAUL DAWES

September 23,1941—May 14, 2023



Larry Dawes was born on in a ranch house on a property that is now the Ventura County Government Center, where his father was the Ranch Foreman. He attended Montalvo Elementary School, was in the first class at Anacapa Junior High, and graduated from Ventura High Class of '59. After college he joined the Air Force during the Vietnam era and served as an Auto Pilot Technician at March Air Force Base and in Guam.

Larry married Carol (Moon) Dawes in 1966. They settled in Ventura where he became an electrician and she taught at Ventura College. They had two children, Lorelle and William (Bill) and he taught them everything from woodworking to camping, plumbing, bicycle repair, etc. He was quite proud of them. Larry was a pilot and taught private lessons. He finished his career maintaining facilities for the County of Ventura.

He could tell stories with the best of them, from history in Ventura as he lived it to random trivia about whatever topic was at hand.

In retirement he was active in the Rotary Club of Ventura and the Retired Men's Club. His love of family and others was apparent to all who knew him in the many ways that he gave back to the community. He passed away after a short illness. He is survived by his wife Carol Dawes, daughter Lorelle Dawes, son Bill Dawes, their spouses Amy Crittenden and Jennifer Dawes and his beloved grandchildren Sophie Dawes and Lydia Dawes.
