


# **CONVERSATIONS IN ROTARY: GREG WRAY**





At our meeting March 22, 2023, club member and "first gentleman" Greg Wray was interviewed by Lynda Girtsman. Greg discussed his fascinating career in illustration and design and shared slides of some of his creations.

Greg knew at the age of 13 exactly what he wanted to do. He attended the University of Illinois and Syracuse University, where he earned his BFA focusing on illustration. He continued his education at ArtCenter College of Design in Pasadena, California.

Greg began his professional career as the art director for a magazine even though he really wanted to do illustration. One day he received a phone call from someone claiming to be from Playboy magazine offering him an illustration job. Greg was almost sure it was a prank, but he went to the meeting anyway and got work illustrating a number of articles for Playboy. He later worked for Disney, right down the hall from Neal Lassila.

When he began, Greg painted with brushes and airbrush. He later expanded his abilities using computer programs like PhotoShop.

Greg's incredibly talented artwork is all around us: from Mickey Mouse to Minions to Bugs Bunny, video games, tour posters for The Who and Genesis, and mascots he designed for the Colorado Rockies and the Florida Marlins. For examples of his work, check out gregwray.com
