Program continued:

most stable joint in the body, he described the early years of hip replacement surgery beginning in the 1960's. The first problem was to find a replacement part that was sturdy enough to last and the second was to combat the problem of infection.

Dr. Culton called the knee, "the most injured joint in the body." The big breakthrough was the advent of arthroscopic surgery.

The shoulder was described as "the most unstable joint in the body," with repairs to torn rotator cuffs being the most prevalent surgery.

Dr. Culton said the future lay in the development of adult stem cell technology whereby, for instance, stem cells could be "sprayed" into a knee to regenerate injured cartilage. He also said there was promising work being done in regenerative medicine
