PACIFIC SPORTS GROUP PRESENTATION



The **Pacific Sports Group** (PSG) gave a presentation at our meeting March 1, 2023, to discuss their proposal for improving the **Ventura County Fairgrounds**. **Phil Ranger**, great-grandson of E.P. Foster, began by discussing the original concept and history of the fairgrounds. **Rick Conrad**, PSG's President and CEO, then discussed the proposal. The projected cost is \$320 million, and development would take six years. The Fair Board (31st District Agricultural Association) would run the County Fair and events under existing contracts. PSG would have a 30-year master lease to run other events.

The current grandstand, which seats 5,500, would be replaced with a baseball stadium that would also be used for concerts and other events and would seat 7,500, with radiant heating imbedded in the concrete. The equestrian area would be increased by 86 percent and parking increased by 516 spaces. The current vehicle entrance would be supplemented by an entrance on Garden Street, improving traffic flow. The Clark Pavilion and the Derby Club would be retained, and the other exhibition halls would be replaced. Restaurants and retail would be added. Most of the opposition at the recent meeting pertained to the proposal's elimination of the Speedway; Rick stated that it was only used 15 times last year.

PSG is currently seeking approval from the Fair Board and private funding.
