in agri-tourism and agri-entertainment. The goal is to bring people into contact with farming to play, pick, buy and learn.



The Underwood family has been farming in Ventura County since 1867 growing beans, lemons, avocados, row crops and cannery tomatoes. Sara's husband Craig, returned to the family business in 1968 after graduating Cornell and serving in Vietnam. He joined his father Richard, in Underwood Ranches, but soon branched out with his father's blessing to create the diverse enterprises that comprise the Underwood Family Farms.

In addition to the farm stand properties in Somis and Moorpark and about 1,000 acres of farmed land, the family has a packing and shipping facility on Flynn Rd. in Camarillo. Their biggest single crop is jalapeno peppers grown for the Huy Fong Company. From July to December they pack and ship 20 tons of peppers a day! Their specialty fruits and vegetables are sold at 14 Southland farmers markets a week. In addition they produce gift baskets and have a Community Supported Agriculture program which delivers fresh produce to subscribers each week.

The most active site is on 100 acres in Moorpark where they host school tours featuring animals, entertainment, education and so much more. Every year more than 40,000 children visit the ranch 20,000 during the monthlong Fall Harvest Festival in October.

The Fall Harvest Festival partners with local non-profits who sell food. Last year the non-profits shared over \$100,000 in profits. The various and creative activities offered by the Underwoods is quite astounding! The growing year ends in December and the Moorpark farm closes with a Christmas Tree sale.
