VCCool

Today' speaker is Rachel Morris. Executive Director of a Westside-based non-profit, VCCool. VCCool , which stands for Ventura Climate Care Options Organized Locally, helps people protect the climate in ways that are affordable, inclusive, and that improve the quality of life for the people of Ventura County. At VCCool, they feel the greatest good they can do for the natural environment is by making city living, healthy and sustainable for all.

They reduce greenhouse gasses through direct bicycle services, helping people get more engaged in their community, education, city planning, and working toward sound public policy. They foster grass-roots communities that embrace sustainable living.

VCCool is a grass-roots 501(c)(3) that incorporated in Ventura in 2007. They consist of four part-time staff, a six-member Board, an impressive Advisory Board, and dozens of community volunteers. They have a community center on Ventura Avenue, a website at VCCool.org, an active Facebook community, and email newsletter. Three key projects of theirs are: the HUB Community Bicycle Shop, Ventura Bicycle Union, and Ventura County Active Transportation Coalition.

Some of their achievements have been: making streets safer for bicycles in Ventura, giving out thousands of bicycle helmets at youth bicycle safety rodeos, spearheading a campaign that moved \$700,000,000 into Active Transportation in Southern California, teaching hundreds of low income bicyclists to fix their own bicycles, working with City planners to provide 35 pages of technical code changes, and adding improvements that were used in the California Drivers Handbook.
