#### PERSPECTIVES ON PEACE

At our meeting May 17, 2023, we honored the winners of this year's Staci Johnson Ingram Memorial Perspectives on Peace Scholarships. Present were VUSD School Board President Sabrena Rodriguez, Board Vice President Dr. Jerry Dannenberg, Director of Secondary Education Bobbi Powers, and Rotary District Governor Scott Phillips. Local access television CAPS Media and the *Ventura Breeze* were present to cover the event.

This is the only artistic merit scholarship exclusively for VUSD students. Eligible are graduating seniors who will be attending a two-year or four-year advanced or technical school. The theme of the competition is peace, defined as an environment that supports equity and justice for all. Submissions may be in in art, photography, video, or music.

We received 25 entries this year. The scholarships are funded primarily by Rotary District grants. The pieces were projected on the monitors, and we watched the winning video entries.



Ken Lendro and Madhu Baja introduced the winners and asked about their educational plans. The winners described their entries and introduced their family members who were present to honor them (a lot were able to join us!). Each winner received a giant check for their scholarship. (I wonder how the bank processes those?)

4th Prize – Juan Orozco Mendez, Buena (digital artwork) (\$750)

5th Prize – Summer Rose Hayashi, Ventura – "Justice Is Peace" (digital artwork) (\$500)

#### **CLUB LEADERSHIP RETREAT**

On Saturday, May 20, 2023, incoming President Neal Lassila led a retreat of 23 current and incoming board members and committee chairs. It was held at Guthrie Hall on the Ventura College campus. (I've never been there before, but it's a good place for a meeting...tables and chairs, AV projector with large screen, a small kitchen, rest rooms, and a door that locked behind Greg when he went out to make a phone call.)

Attached is a list of incoming officers and directors. There are positions still to be filled, so speak up if you're interested!

We discussed SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats). It's important to note that any final decisions will be made by the incoming board. Also, these are just my notes and not anybody's official position. But here are some of the ideas we talked about:

We discussed the flier (attached) that highlights the major themes from the recent club survey:

Communication: Explore possibility of Outlook calendar invitations for events. Consider a ClubRunner clinic at a meeting to make sure this resource is available to everyone. Share more information from board meetings and financial information. Publish Who Does What list and a list of open opportunities for committees, projects, etc. Need two additional people to help with external communications and online improvements.

*Engagement*: Consider reinstating a Sunshine Committee or other mechanism to follow up on members who stop attending, to send condolence cards, etc. Make more short-term projects available for those who don't want to commit to being committee chair, etc. Compile a list of people's *passions* (not necessarily their professions) as a resource for projects. Also mentioned the recently added Club Program Committee, led by Madhu, to guide Club Meeting programs and speakers.

Connection: Improve opportunities to get to know each other better. Should we have more variety in meeting format, like having some meetings where we socialize rather than having a program? Highlight a couple members each week on the AV monitors before the formal meeting begins?

We discussed ways of retaining members, attracting new members, and increasing diversity. We also discussed how to structure the funding for Interact Clubs...an unrestricted grant for the year, or on a project-by-project basis?

We discussed all the projects we did this year (there were a lot...see attached list) and whether we should replace some of them with more effective programs. For example, there was little participation in the Four-Way-Test essay contest this year...should we replace it, for example, with sponsoring more RYLA spots or increasing Perspectives for Peace scholarships? The Food Share Can Tree comes at a busy time of year and had little participation...perhaps hold our own food drive? Rotarians at Work Day is international...we might consider a project other than through Habitat for Humanity. We have participated in the Backpack and Dictionary projects for years...are these the best ways to support our students? (Lots of strong opinions about how to improve the Dictionary Project!)

We have an exciting year in front us, with lots of energy. Have ideas? Sure you do! Contact Neal, Sandy, or Madhu.
