### Program continued

California Grand Juries are unique because of their <u>civil</u> <u>oversight function</u>. They were established to protect citizens and society and keep a watchful eye on certain aspects of government. In 1791 Grand Juries became part of the United States Constitution, the Fifth Amendment, and part of the California Constitution in 1879.



California grand juries hold inquiries and perform investigations. The grand jury does not decide guilt or innocence. Its function is inquisitorial and accusatorial. Although the jury works with the County Council for legal guidance, it is not under their control.

Its power over witnesses resembles that of a trial court. Witnesses must appear and usually must testify. Refusal may constitute contempt. Examination of witnesses is at the jury's discretion. The proceedings are secret and informal.

The grand jury is an investigative body created for the protection of society and the enforcement of the law. Although the responsibilities are many and diverse, the four predominant functions of a juror include:

Civil Government Oversight.

Citizen Complaints.

Accusations.

Reporting.

### May 25: Ventura Boys & Girls Club

# Who was Julius Gius?

Just about every member of R C Ventura is familiar with the Julius Gius Foundation, which supports many of our club's community service projects. However, few know anything about who Julius Gius was and why our club Foundation was named after him. Thanks to PP Norm Blacher for the following information:

Julius Gius was born in Fairbanks, Alaska in 1911. His family moved to Washington where he attended school in Tacoma and a few years at the University of Puget Sound, while he worked part-time ate the Tacoma Times.

In 1935, the Scripps League of Newspapers launched a new daily newspaper – the Bremerton Sun – and appointed Gius as its first editor. In 1960, Gius was appointed editor of the Sun's sister newspaper, the Ventura Star Press, by Roy Pinkerton, the owner and editor.

Julius was a hard working newspaper man and served as the Star editor until 1987. He was well respected and was known county-wide. He developed a team at the Star that produced a very good paper. He wrote hard-charging editorials and was a fearless newspaper man – somewhat old-fashioned.

He was a strong Rotarian and presented the news at each Rotary meeting. He loved to socialize with fellow Rotarians.

The group that founded the Julius Gius Foundation, which included Felice Ginsberg and Jim Deardorff, believed he represented the best values of Rotary as well as the citizens of Ventura County.
