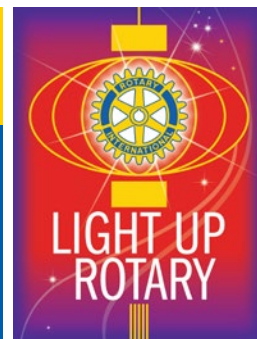

Mentalist Lincoln Kamm



Today's presenter is Lincoln Kamm who will perform a unique blend of high impact magic, improvised situational comedy, and interactive ESP demonstrations.

Lincoln has performed over two hundred shows at the world famous Magic Castle in Hollywood since 2005, plus per-

formances at Harrah's Casino, The Key Club, The Livery Theater, Judd's Hill Winery, The Purple Orchid, and countless corporate events in the USA, UK, Sweden, Canada, and Japan.

He is famous for his high-end and sophisticated, yet very funny and friendly style of entertainment.

Lincoln has made 8 appearances on one of the highest rated morning news shows in Los Angeles, KTLA Morning News. He also has a his own monthly stage show the second Saturday every month at "The House of Magic" in Ventura.

Lincoln's lifelong passion for entertaining others through his art began at the early age of 8 years old. By the time he was 11, Lincoln was working regularly at private parties and restaurants doing magic. He found his way to Los Angeles in 1989 to study magic at the prestigious Chavez College of Magic, as well as photography and character animation at California Institute of the Arts.

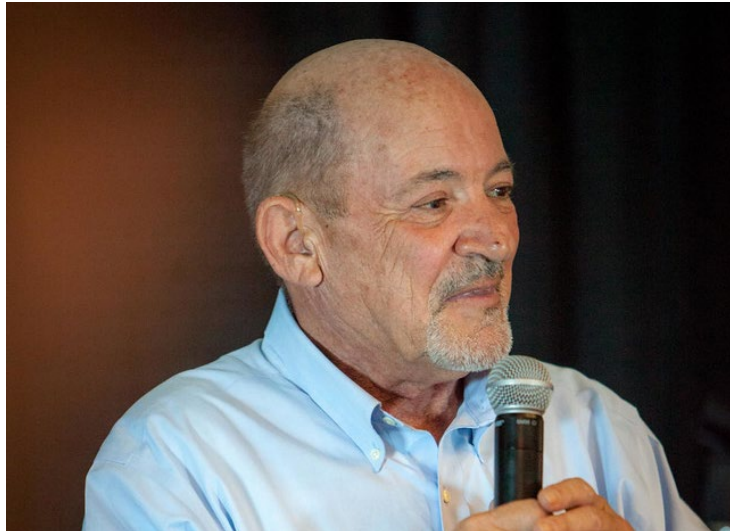

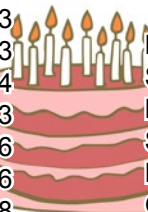
