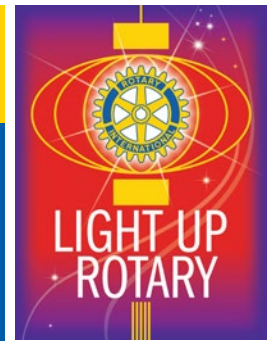

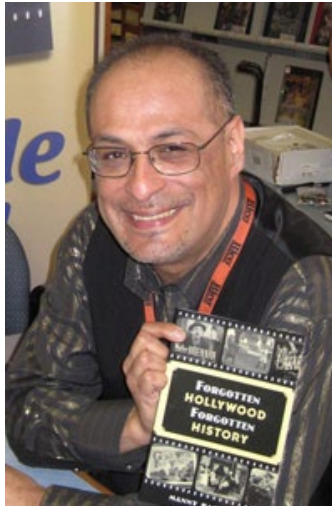

Forgotten Hollywood

Author Manny Pacheco has enjoyed a growing acclaim through his Forgotten Hollywood Book Series, now included in the library collections of the Hollywood Heritage Museum, Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, American Film Institute, among other. He's currently in production to turn his literary work into a Forgotten Hollywood Documentary.



A Southern California television and radio personality for over three decades, Manny was on NBC's Santa Barbara, co-hosted the Daytime Emmy-nominated In Studio on KCOP, and he currently hosts Forgotten Hollywood, a weekly syndicated radio program on the Financial News and Talk Network.

He's moderated public television pledge drives (KCET). Manny had a principal role in a documentary, Karaoke Fever, featured at the Los Angeles Film Festival in 2001. Pacheco received a Best Weblog accolade from the Los Angeles Press Club's 54th Annual Southern California Journalism Awards.

Manny is also a voice-over commercial actor, and clients have included FORD, GTE, ARCO, MILLER LITE and HONDA. He has worked on KRLA, KFI, and KBIG. He's been a broadcaster in Los Angeles his entire career. He currently hosts FORGOTTEN HOLLYWOOD radio show on 15-10 Financial News & Talk on the Astor Broadcasting Group.

Pacheco is a thirty-year member of the Screen Actor's Guild, the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists and the youngest member of Pacific Pioneer Broadcasters. Manny wrote an article about his experience at the 2008 Screen Actors Guild Awards that appeared on LA Radio.com and in Karaoke Scene Magazine.

A Los Angeles-native, Manny received his undergraduate degree at UCLA in Bachelor of Arts, Political Science. He is happily married to Laurie, and they live in Cypress, CA.

Global Polio Update: Mixed News

As of November 4, 2014, two new cases of circulating vaccine derived polio virus (cVDPV) have been reported in South Sudan, constituting an outbreak. Immunization activities are planned in November and December in order to stop the spread of cVDPV. Immunization campaigns in Iraq in September reached 88% of children under 5. Around 20 million children were vaccinated across the Middle East in October. These activities are helping to protect the gains made against the virus in the region, with no case reported for nearly 7 months. In central Africa, it has been 6 months since the latest case of polio in Equatorial Guinea. In Cameroon, high



level delegates from the World Health Organization, UNICEF and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention met with the Prime Minister and the Minister of Health in order to discuss the urgency of the outbreak response

Afghanistan: Six new wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) cases were reported in the past week in Afghanistan. Of these, 4 are from Kandahar province (2 in Kandahar district, and 1 in each of the previously uninfected districts of Shahwalikot and Arghandab); 1 is from the Bermel district of Paktika province, and 1 from the previously uninfected

province of Ghazni, in Giro district. The most recent case had onset of paralysis on 4 October in Arghandab district, Kandahar province. The total number of WPV1 cases is now 18.

Nigeria: No new case of WPV1 was reported in the past week. Nigeria's total case count for 2014 remains 6. The most recent case had onset of paralysis on 24 July in Sumaila Local Government Area (LGA), southern Kano state.

Pakistan: Fifteen new wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) cases were reported in the past week in Pakistan. Of these, 8 are from the Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA) (1 from South Waziristan, 1 from Frontier Region Bannu and 6 from Khyber Agency); 3 from Balochistan province (2 from Killa Abdullah district and 1 from Quetta); and 4 from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) province (3 from Peshawar district and 1 from Charsada district, previously uninfected in 2014). The most recent case had onset of paralysis on 20 October in South Waziristan. This brings the total number of WPV1 cases in 2014 to 235 compared to 56 in 2013 by this date.

Polio infection kills and injures kids

Out of 200 kids infected:



1 will be paralyzed

8 will suffer from viral meningitis

191 may have no symptoms BUT are contagious...and the other kids they pass the virus to may not be as lucky

Up to 5% of those paralyzed will die because polio affects the muscles that help them breathe

Polio's effects are serious and permanent

Muscle weakness, chronic fatigue and pain severely limit the activities of people struck by polio.

Even children who seem to fully recover can develop new muscle pain, weakness, or paralysis as adults, at 50 or 60 years old. This is called post-polio syndrome.

In the countries where children still get polio, the disease reduces earning potential, prospects for marriage and a family of one's own. Polio impacts one's daily life.
