Program: Joslynn Skelton began our program honoring the 37,000 **veterans** in Ventura County by playing a **medley of Armed Forces songs**. Each **veteran present was recognized** by standing and giving their branch of service.




Will Ray, Jr. of the Ventura Chapter of Disabled American Veterans (DAV) discussed the challenges and long delays many veterans have faced to receive services from the Veterans Administration. The DAV is the largest veterans service organization in the world and helps veterans with their claims. They also fight for legislation every year to receive adequate compensation. Any veteran, whether disabled or not, can join DAV. Every veteran who ever served the U.S. has

sacrificed their life in the service of our county—some instantaneously, others over their lifetimes. That sacrifice is made for the betterment of our country.

Charles Foote, also of DAV Ventura, discussed the importance of veterans signing up for VA services, even if they don't need services now, so Congress will more fully fund VA services.

Susie Hicks discussed her personal journey as a veteran, and the importance of singing in that journey.

We ended with a **Prayer for Veterans**, and with our gratitude for their service.



¹ <u>Bonus information</u>: "The Army Goes Rolling Along" was adapted from "The Caissons Go Rolling Along," written in 1908 by Brigadier General Edmund "Snitz" Gruber, and adapted into a march by John Philip Sousa. "Anchors Aweigh" was first played at the Army-Navy football game in 1906 (the Navy won 10-0). "The Marines' Hymn" was updated in 1942 to change "On the land as on the sea" to "In the air, on land, and sea" to acknowledge the important role of aviation in the Corps. The final line of the "U.S. Air Force Song" was changed in 1947 from "Nothing'll stop the Army Air Corps" to "Nothing'll stop the U.S. Air Force." Unfortunately, "Corps" does not rhyme with "roar" or "soar" in preceding lines, but the change was necessary when the USAF became a separate branch of service. The U.S. Coast Guard song "Semper Paratus" (Always Ready) is named for the USCG motto.

George Poulakos has been a Rotarian for 10 years and has been in three Rotary clubs (Fort Lauderdale, Taos and Ventura). He is currently serving as chair of the district grants committee for District 5240. In 2024/25, he will be our club president and will also serve as International Service Chair for the district.

George is the project lead on an economic development global grant project in Zambia, He has volunteered for Rotary projects in Guatemala,

Zambia and Greece. He has also done non-Rotary projects in South Africa, Tanzania, and Greece as well as ongoing volunteer work for a rare disease community in the US. His classification is advertising and he is a PH +8.

Rena Sepulveda joined our club in August. She has dedicated most of her professional life to housing, particularly affordable housing for vulnerable populations. She has worked for Turning Point Foundation since October 2015. She is currently the Director of Contracts and Grants. Turning Point Foundation specializes in community based mental health services and housing for persons with mental health challenges. It works with clients to reverse the devastating effects of their illnesses, such as job loss, homelessness, isolation, addiction, incarceration, and thoughts of suicide. Assisting those with the day-to-day challenges of recovery of their mental health and transitioning from homelessness.



Prior to her experience at Turning Point Foundation, Rena was at Cabrillo Economic Development Corporation (CEDC) for five years. At CEDC, Rena gained experience in many

facets of affordable housing, community building and engagement and organizational development. Rena has a B.A. in Political Science and Sociology from the University of California, Berkeley. Rena has been on the Ventura County Housing Opportunities Made Easier Board since 2013, serving as Treasurer for six years and Chair for two years. Rena serves as Treasurer of the Ventura County Medical Center Community Health Care Board. She has served on this board since 2017. She also serves on the board of small start-up non-profit, Stairway to Recovery.
