David Shea began by introducing Albert McCartney who told the club about their recent trip to Honduras.



He gave a brief history lesson of Roatan, then proceeded with a slide show of their trip. They carried a great deal of medication and soccer balls. The medication was to support a clinic that is located in a neighborhood where there is significant need. The clinic was founded

in 2002 by <u>Glendafae</u>, a guest of our club today. Everyone who traveled with them was invited to enjoy a celebration for the 8th anniversary of the clinic - lots of singing and lots of prayer – there were local dignitaries who joined in to celebrate the progress of the clinic.

Three doctors traveled with Albert and David; their first task was to organize and inventory all medications, but their main mission was to provide services for those living in Roatan. The line started early in the morning and people kept coming all day long. Another important goal of the trip was to build relationships



with the locals - finding what the needs are and what Rotary can do to assist.

The group also participated in two outreach excursions by going out into the sparsely populated areas and serving those who couldn't make it to the clinic and needed assistance. David thanked CMH for their generous contributions of medications and funds.

Prez Hutch's Final Thought included a reminder that November is Rotary Foundation month and next week's program will be about The Rotary Foundation (TRF).

Nominations and Election Process for Officers and Board Members

Recently our club's board of directors voted to reconfigure its makeup. <u>Our new board of directors will consist of: President, Past President, President Elect, and 10 Board Members (5 of which will chair our 5 Avenues of Service: Club, Vocational, Community, International, and New Generations, plus 5 that will understudy and take the Chair positions the following year). There are also two Ex officio positions: Attendance Clerk and Recording Clerk.</u>

<u>Our Nominations Committee is always made up of Past Presidents.</u> This year the committee consists of: Terry Schaeffer, Steve Doll, Jim Deardorff, and Curtis Cormane.

The Committee's first order of business is to recruit and vet the potential president two years down the line, particularly making sure they have the inclination and the time to devote to being our club's President. It is almost a 3 year commitment which starts with their training in September with further training in February prior to their taking office. Our club also prefers that our presidential candidate is already a Master PRLS graduate.

Once this is completed, the <u>Nominations Committee works closely with the President Elect and President Elect Nominee to fill the remaining board and officer positions</u>. All of these candidates have been approached and know what will be required of them to lead our club on to bigger and better things. All this has to be completed prior to the election that usually occurs on or about the first <u>Wednesday of December</u>. According to our By-Laws, the Nominations Committee makes their <u>announcement at a regular club meeting and then the nominations are published in our club's bulletin up to the election.</u>

The election is an open process conducted at our regular meeting on or about the first Wednesday of December. Following the Nominations Committee report, nominations are then opened to the membership. If nominations are made, ballots will be passed out to our membership and voting will follow. If there are no nominations from the floor; a motion will be requested to except the Nominations Committee's report and that a unanimous ballot be cast. Call me with any questions,
