CONVERSATIONS IN ROTARY

Our meeting November 15, 2023, featured interviews by Lynda Girtsman of one of our newest members, and a more "seasoned" member.



Rena Sepulveda has been a member since August. She has devoted most of her professional life to housing, particularly for those with mental health issues and other vulnerable populations. She is currently Director of Contracts and Grants for Turning Point Foundation, which provides housing, rehabilitation & recovery programs, and heath navigation for those in our community dealing with mental illness. She previously worked at Cabrillo Economic Development

Corporation. Rena is developing her own non-profit, Stairway to Recovery. Rena was born in Santa Paula, attended Poinsettia Elementary School, attended middle school and high school in Santa Paula, and earned her B.A. in Policial Science and Sociology at Berkeley. She has two dogs: Jake and Otis.

George Poulakos has been a Rotarian for 10 years and a member of our club for seven. After his wife's death 6 months ago, he returned from Florida to Ventura. He is our President Elect and will also serve next year as the district's International Service Chair.

We almost lost George to the Kiwanis Club. He was a member of their Key Club and his grandfather was a Kiwanian. But when Geroge was doing an AIDS documentary in Cape Town he lost a bet to some



Rotarians and had to participate in a charity event with them. He manages a global grant with 21 other clubs to keep young girls in Botswana and Zambia from the sex trade. He has spent a lot of time in Africa and has seen it first-hand what distinguishes Rotary: what we do for the rest of the world. "Rotarians build relationships so people can build their lives."



Nov. 29 lunch meeting: Ben Rode and **Nancy O'Rode** with **Ondulando Firewise.** Ben and Nancy have lived in Ventura since 1990. Ben is retired after teaching mathematics for 25 years at Moorpark College. Nancy is retired after being an associate professor at CSU Northridge and had the pleasure of teaching people who wanted to become elementary teachers.

They met as Peace Corps Volunteers in the Fiji Islands teaching math to prospective elementary teachers. Before Fiji, Ben was writing mathematics curricula in Thai, as a Peace Corps Volunteer. They have taught in International Schools in Madrid and Nairobi and in private and public schools in California. Ben and Nancy are bird watchers, hikers, tent campers, and enjoy traveling.

Ben and Nancy will discuss the formation of Ondulando Firewise. The Ventura Fire Dept. and the Ventura Regional Fire Safe Council announced Ondulando as the City of Ventura's inaugural nationally recognized Firewise USA community. Firewise USA is a program by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) that acknowledges communities that take proactive measures to minimize wildfire risks through organized collaboration and action. Ondulando's achievement reflects a united effort among its 640 property owners to enhance safety for all residents in Ventura County. They will also provide tips on how we can be more fire safe.
