


Craft Talks Featuring Barbara Fitzgerald and Mahesh Talwar

Barbara Fitzgerald has recently rejoined our club after a brief hiatus and is a multiple Paul Harris fellow. She is a 30 year resident of Ventura and is retired from the County of Ventura Human Services Agency after 34 years. As Director of the HSA, she managed a budget of \$165 million and some 1,100 employees. She successfully worked with Sacramento and Washington D.C., increasing funding for Ventura County programs and creating many programs that benefit children and families in our community. Barbara has been recognized by many organizations throughout Ventura County as a strong leader, true innovator and a person who has made a difference in the lives of children.

Barbara has served on the Ventura Unified School District Board of Education since 2003. She values and respects the opinions of students, parents and teachers and will listen to concerns. Barbara believes strongly in equality and access to needed services to prepare all of youth for their tomorrows.

Barbara is an accomplished artist. She grew up in Madison, Connecticut where she was surrounded by artists in the community as well as her artist mother, Rita Beecher-Powell.

Mahesh Talwar holds a MSChE degree and his work is related to air pollution control. That work has earned him a US President's award and a California Governor's award. He started his career first working in the chemical and petrochemical design industry and then moved on as a Senior Scientist for the California Air Pollution Control Agency. He has published extensively and is the author of two technical books. He also taught course in air pollution control engineering at University of California, Santa Barbara and has five patents (pending) on diesel engine emissions controls and biofuels area.



Mahesh is President and CEO of OceanAir Environmental, LLC, a firm operating out of Somis, California. EPA certified kits for EMD 645 series engines (tug boats, locomotives), biodiesel production technologies, biomass to liquid production.

His education includes M.S., Chemical Engineering from California Polytechnic State University Pomona (1980 – 82), Institute of Technology and a BS, Chemical Engineering (1973 – 78) from Banaras Hindu University.

Rotarian, Donald Lee Leach (1934 - 2012)



Don was a Captain in the United States Marine Corps. Enlisting in 1957, he was discharged in 1962 only to be recalled to active service in 1965 and discharged again in 1967. During his time in the Corps, Don was stationed in Okinawa and served in Vietnam. Don was also an instructor at College of the Redwoods in Humboldt County, and Golden Gate University.

Don joined the California Highway Patrol in 1962 serving in many areas in California as he progressed through the ranks. Starting as a Patrol Officer in Eureka, he worked as a Motorcycle Training Officer in South Central, returned to Eureka as a Sargent later transferring to Sacramento where he was promoted to Lieutenant. In 1977, when he attained the rank of Captain, he was stationed briefly in Santa Barbara before being assigned to Ventura where he retired as Area Commander in 1991.

During his tenure as Ventura Commander, he served as the Area Coordinator for athlete transportation and safety for the 1984 Summer Olympics. Don passed the Bar in 1989 and began his career as an attorney at law specializing in Estate, Probate, and Family Law, retiring in July 2012.

Don Leach had an epic association with Rotary, having spent 31 years in clubs in Ventura County. That alone is remarkable, but even more so is his 31 years of PERFECT ATTENDANCE. Don first started out in 1981 as a member of Ventura Rotary Club for seven years. He then transferred to the Thousand Oaks Club for six years, before returning to our club the last eighteen years. Don is a multiple Paul Harris Fellow, having been awarded two; in 1986 and 1999. He awarded his wife, Mary, a Paul Harris Fellow in 1988. Don had spent over 15 years in various Ventura Rotary board positions, including a stint as Club President for the 2000-01 year. He had also served two periods as Club Secretary 1995-2000 and 2002-04. He also chaired the Julius Gius Memorial Rotary Foundation in 2005-06. His last service to the club has been as Attendance Chair from 2004-present. Don's fastidious attendance-taking has helped our club to be one of the district's leaders in high attendance.

Don also perennially called on Club members to serve with him as security detail for the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life event. He would implore and cajole Rotarians to help in this event he cared so much about.

One fond memory of Don for me is from that Cancer walk. I usually pulled the Sunday morning shift which is always the quietest, so we Rotarians could just sit at the gate and shoot the breeze. Don would stick around for pretty much the whole event, sleeping in his big sedan nearby. When breakfast was served, Don would round up a couple of extra sausages for Jim Deardorff's 'sentry' dogs and we'd get a kick out of watching the pooches 'perform' for their food.

Don Leach was the consummate gentleman. He had such an even temperament, a warm smile and a deep laugh and I recall that served him well as Club President. I served on his board, which, in Rotary, tends to be peopled by over-achieving Type 'A's (well-meaning, mind you), so that temperament kept meetings calm and productive. I recall talking to him after he returned to the club following the passing of his beloved wife of 57 years, Mary. I remarked that I was glad to see him back sooner than I expected and he said that it made him feel better to be back with his Rotary friends. A gentleman, indeed.
