<u>Dictionary Project:</u> This is an important piece of literacy. Margo (pictured below) is our chair; last year we delivered 1300 dictionaries to schools; we will do this again, in

January. We deliver to all public and many private schools, 13-25 schools in all, and we need at least 13-25 volunteers to take the dictionaries to the schools, meet with the students, use the dictionaries briefly to introduce to them the concept and meaning of service, and to talk about Rotary and what we do. Margo read a cute letter from a student.

<u>Gold Coast Ride for</u> <u>Literacy:</u> April 16th, 2011. Bob Schilken is the Chair. Half the proceeds go to the Adult Literacy program. <u>Reading in Schools:</u> Todd Binkley is the Cochair, will be done again on Dr. Seuss Day. Volunteers go to the schools and read



books and/or stories to the students.

<u>Four-Way Essay Test Essay Contest:</u> Lorelle Dawes at VHS may help us do the 4-way test at VHS with the AVID program.

National Geographic Kids Magazines: Delivered magazines to 4th graders; delivered 190 subscriptions to kids; many students showed Scott their dictionaries we had given them last year as third graders. <u>Proposed additional projects:</u> Vocational service ethics award; college or vocational scholarships on 4-way test; provide all members with Declaration of Rotarians in business and professions; career talks – have guest speakers from club give talks to Interact students. Scott concluded by saying that we can impact all professions and students.

COATS FOR KIDS PROJECT IN ITS 7TH YEAR IN 2010

This is the 7th year of collaboration between the Rotary Club of Ventura and Four Seasons Cleaners to help keep children and adults in our communities warm this winter. This year, several other local Rotary clubs will join the effort. Collection boxes will be distributed to businesses, school, government centers and public parks in Ventura County in early November.

Rotarians will collect the donated coats and jackets, deliver them to Four Seasons Cleaners on Main Street for cleaning and sorting, then distribute them to service organizations and schools in the community, such as the <u>Boys & Girls Clubs of Oxnard and Ventura</u>, the Rescue Mission, the Salvation Army, local churches, <u>Casa Pacifica and others</u>. While the project is called "Coats for Kids", <u>we do accept all sizes of coats and jackets</u>; in past years, about 60% of coats collected and distributed were adult size.

Each year, our club also distributes coats to children at our annual Christmas Party on the second Wednesday of December. Last year, over 50 needy elementary schools kids from the lower grades of <u>Lincoln, E P Foster and Sheridan Way schools</u> were able to select coats for themselves as well as family members.

<u>The project will continue until December 31, 2010</u>. In addition to R C Ventura and Four Seasons Cleaners, the project is co-sponsored by Ventura County Star and Gold Coast Broadcasting.

Because of the current economic conditions, the need for coats is greater than ever before. <u>Our goal is to collect and distribute 10,000 coats and jackets</u>.
