
PRESIDENT-ELECT'S MESSAGE

PROGRAM – CONVERSATIONS IN ROTARY



Club member Karynsue Rose-Thomas was interviewed by Lynda Girtsman.

Karynsue described her "accident-prone" childhood, including some "accidents" facilitated by her brother. She made her first foray into finance when she traded dimes with her brother for nickels—a good trade in her mind because nickels are bigger.

Karynsue obtained her bachelor's degree in architecture from Florida A&M University, where she designed and built a giant rattlesnake to participate in a parade. The snake was too heavy for her and her fellow architecture students to lift, so she recruited the aid of other students and thereby furthered inter-racial rapport. She earned a Masters of Science Healthcare Management from Marymount University and a Master Certificate in IT/IS Project Management from Villanova University.

As a lieutenant in the Navy, Karynsue served as the operations and regulatory officer for a 350-bed tertiary hospital in Portsmouth, Virginia, and received numerous medals and commendations. She left the Navy and became a manager at Adventist Health System in St. Helena, California. There she was active in Rotary but was unable to join because the chapter already had its quota of hospital employees. She and her partner developed a non-profit to aid Nicaragua that built schools and playgrounds and brought in optometrists to perform cataract operations.

When COVID hit, Karynsue quit her corporate job and purchased 43-foot RV, which she used to visit 18 states, with a Harley on a trailer in tow.

Karynsue's latest venture is KRAVE in Portside, Ventura Harbor. Construction started this week, and she hopes to open in April or May. It will be a gelato and coffee bar and sell handcrafted botanical products. She will employ Pacific High School students as chefs and in other positions in keeping with her philosophy that not everyone can go to college, but everyone can excel at life.
