Daily life included lots of class work and entertainment, talent shows, themed days, Sea Olympics, Neptune day, ambassadors ball, formal dining, and meetings with

SAE fraternity brothers. All his professors were from Harvard. Highlights of the four-and-a-half-month cruise included stops in Spain, Morocco, Ghana, South Africa, Mauritius, India, Vietnam, China and Japan. He tried to look at the country, culture and people from a political science perspective and how Americans had influenced their lives. He felt there was "American influence everywhere...People assume you are rich.. Traveling makes one proud to be an American."
